

# Blood-sucker sequel's script is trash

'HSM' star talks about nudity • Beyoncé wows kids with her first voiceover project

A script for "Twilight" sequel "New Moon" and another movie, "Memoirs," were uncovered by a beauty-salon owner in a trash container outside a St. Louis hotel. The woman's lawyer said his client thought about leaking the scripts to a tabloid or keeping them, but decided to turn them over to the studio making the movies. The studio invited her to attend both premieres. The scripts were found outside a hotel where "Up In the Air" cast members were staying. One of them, **Anna Kendrick**, is supposed to appear in "New Moon," but her rep said the trashed script wasn't hers.

Sibling attorneys **Victor Jih**, 36, and **Tammy Jih**, 27, won "The Amazing Race 14." They agreed physical challenges were the toughest part of earning the \$1 million. Victor, hailing from Los Angeles, said he'd pay down his credit debt. Tammy, of San Francisco, planned to take care of her law-school loans — and get a pair of black peep-toe **Christian Louboutin** shoes.

It's been a big year for **Jimmy Fallon**. The "Saturday Night Live" alum started his stint as NBC's "Late Night" host and received his bachelor's degree in communications. The 34-year-old had attended Saint Rose in Albany, N.Y., 1992-95 but dropped out a semester shy of graduating in favor of pursuing his comedy career in Los Angeles. And 14 years later, he presented his TV/film portfolio to college officials to prove he'd fulfilled the core curriculum through real-life experience. He also was keynote speaker at the graduation.

Although **Lance Armstrong** and girlfriend **Anna Hansen** are expecting a baby in June, the seven-time **Tour de France** winner said he and singer **Sheryl Crow** split three years ago because she wanted marriage and children. He said he'd just gotten out of a marriage and had kids. Crow moved on, adopting son **Wyatt** in 2007. The breakup is one topic in "Lance" by **John Wilcockson** due out in July.

Actress and humanitarian **Mia Farrow** embarked on a 21-day hunger strike to protest the Sudanese president's expulsion of 16 aid agencies in Darfur, putting a million people at risk of starvation. But the 64-year-old UNICEF goodwill ambassador ended

it after 12 days, when her doctor told her she could have seizures due to low blood sugar. The disappointed Farrow had been unable to stand and began regaining her strength with oranges and soup.

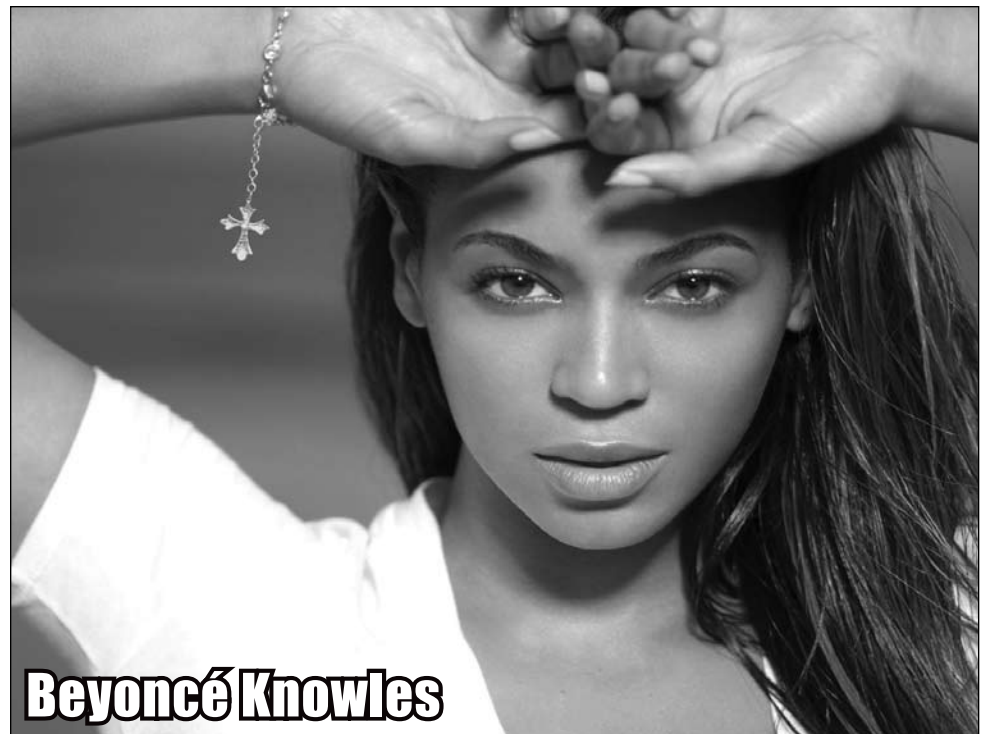
"Star Trek" beamed up an estimated \$75.5 million at the box office in its opening weekend — plus the \$4 million raised during its Thursday-night screenings. "Star Trek" also set a new IMAX opening-weekend record with 8.2 million dollars, surpassing the 6.3 million made by "The Dark Knight" last summer.

**Paula Abdul** presented a guide dog to **Scott MacIntyre** in May to celebrate National Guide Dog month. The visually impaired "American Idol" contestant voted off in April won't actually get the dog until he completes the "Idol" tour in September. The gift was a surprise because he expected to perform at the ceremony. Abdul is working with companies to raise funds and awareness for guide dogs.

After the controversial photos of **Miss California USA Carrie Prejean** appeared on the Internet, the world's largest adult film studio offered her \$1 million to star in one of its upcoming movies. **Vivid Entertainment** co-chair **Steven Hirsch** said the business deal "could be an important step for her towards expanding her horizons."

**Vanessa Hudgens** said she'd be willing to show nudity in an amazing movie she's really passionate about if the film calls for it — but she's not comfortable with it right now. The 20-year-old "High School Musical" star is in on "Beastly," billed as a modern-day "Beauty and the Beast," and "Sucker Punch" about a young girl institutionalized by her stepfather.

One of the last surviving Munchkins from "The Wizard of Oz" (1939) died in his sleep May 7 in St. Louis at age 89. **Mickey Carroll** was one of more than 100 adults and children cast to play Munchkinland residents. Carroll was the town crier, a Munchkin soldier and a fiddler who helped escort **Dorothy (Judy Garland)** down the yellow brick road. Carroll said he earned \$125 per week while filming. Although Carroll left show business in the 1940s to run the family head-

stone-making business in St. Louis, he and six other surviving Munchkins received a star on the **Hollywood Walk of Fame** in 2007.

**Beyoncé Knowles** made her debut as a voiceover actress on "Wow! Wow! Wubbzy!," Nickelodeon's Emmy Award-winning animated preschool series. Knowles was the voice of **Shine**, lead singer of **The Wubb Girlz**, for a four-day special. She actually composed and performed an original tune for the series, "Sing a Song," that's available through digital outlets. This was Knowles' first children's project. She said she was happy to do the show because she finally was able to impress her nephew.

**Bruce Willis' Valley Entertainment Group**, owner of **Soldier Mountain Ski Resort** in central Idaho, plans to rebuild the main ski lodge. It'll be larger than the one that burned down March 30 and open in time for the next ski season.

Actor **Ryan O'Neal** told *People* in May that **Farrah Fawcett's** medical treatment in an almost three-year cancer battle was ending. He said his longtime partner had lost all her trademark blond hair and was staying in bed. NBC aired "Farrah's Story" May 15. The 62-year-old actress documented her illness in the two-hour special and detailed her trips overseas for treatment not readily available in the United States. O'Neal

said he didn't tell Fawcett about son **Redmond's** legal troubles, and he lied to Redmond about his mother's condition when he was granted three hours out of jail April 25 to spend with his mother. Of his role as caregiver, O'Neal told *People*, "It's a love story. I just don't know how to play this one. I won't know this world without her."

**Susan Boyle**, the 47-year-old singer who became a YouTube sensation with her performance of "I Dreamed a Dream" on "Britain's Got Talent," told **Oprah Winfrey** on her May 11 show she started singing as a child to cope with a learning disability. But she stopped for a while after her mother died in 2007. Boyle said she wasn't sure she'd win the show because there was a lot of "other talent."

A series of five U.S. stamps honors "The Simpsons," making the longest-running comedy series in television history the only program to be featured on a stamp while still in production. **Homer** and family are in their 20th season, tying "Gunsmoke" (1955-75) as America's longest-running primetime series. Fox recently renewed the show for two more seasons.

**Jay Leno** did two free "Comedy Stimulus" shows for 8,000 people in Wilmington, Ohio. The city has lost thousands of jobs eliminated from **DHL**, with more to come as the shipping company relocates this summer.
